Welcome to the Troll Museum – the first museum in Norway dedicated entirely to trolls and fairy tales. Centrally located in Tromsø city, we aim to bring you closer to the magic of Norwegian folk beliefs and the creatures that populate them.



Our museum is a small and cozy venue and our approach is based on a combination of handmade art, attention to detail, and modern technology. The exhibits incorporate augmented reality features which superimpose moving elements and sound to the art you can see. This translates into a unique and different museum experience where you can dip your toes into Norwegian folklore and discover how the idea of trolls has changed over time.

FAIRY TALES

A significant part of our exhibits revolves around Norwegian fairy tales and their protagonists. These fairy tales showcase different types of trolls such as the mountain, sea, and forest trolls.



Our exhibits relies on the work of collectors of fairy tales Asbjørnsen and Moe, as well as illustrations by Theodor Kittelsen. It is mainly thanks to them that all these stories have survived to this day. You can learn more about them and their work in our museum.



TROLLS

It is believed that these incredible creatures are descendants of the Jotuns, the giants whose story begins at the same time as the origin of the universe and the creation of the world. These are terrible and dangerous creatures that resemble a huge stone from afar. Noticing them is not always easy, but it is possible.



In our museum you can measure your height against a troll's, learn about their other distinctive features, imagine yourself as a troll, find a sea troll in the Tromsø fjords, and much more.

Some of our trolls live on through Augmented Reality and you can even take one of them home with you.



AUGMENTED REALITY

Augmented Reality, commonly known as AR, is the process of using technology to superimpose animations, images, text, or sounds on top of what a person can already see.



We use tablets with AR to bring to you animated fairy tale characters which you will not find anywhere else.

Note that you don't need any special equipment of your own, since our tablets are already installed and available free of charge.



MYTHS

People develop different systems of belief as an attempt to explain everything that happens around them. An example of these stories include the myths surrounding Yggdrasil, the sacred world tree in Norse mythology.



Or you may be more interested in the waterfall spirit, the Fossegrim, a mysterious character who plays the Norwegian Hardanger fiddle whom you can meet at the end of our exhibit.



GAMES & BOOKS

Yes, you got that right - games! Since our museum is dedicated to unusual creatures, we decided to add a few games of logic and dexterity inspired by our trolls. A non-standard activity for a non-standard museum, if you will. Our games are designed for at least two players, but you can also practice alone.



To help with immersion during your visit, we have made available a collection of Norse legends and other translated tales from around the world in our library. We have books in Norwegian, English and other languages.



SOUVENIRS

If you want to surprise your friends and loved ones with something a little different, then our souvenirs with augmented reality are just what you need!



We sell magnets, postcards, cups and puzzles with the same AR features used in the museum exhibits. You need only download our free mobile application (available for Android and iOS) and watch as the trolls come to life in your very hands!
